He is a 1973 graduate of South Granville High School and Liberty University (Magna Cum Laude) with a BS Degree in Business Management & Religion, UNC-Chapel Hill's School of Government with a Certification in County Administration, and the United States Army Sergeant's Major Academy at Ft Bliss in El Paso, Texas. During his senior year in high school, Turner joined the NC Army National Guard in Butner and served both his Country and State for 34 years. Upon his retirement he transferred into the United States Army Reserve to an Inactive Ready Reserve Status for 8 additional years. In his civilian career, Turner worked for Durham County Government for 33 years as the Director of General Services from 1976 until his retirement in 2010.
